This Is The Way It Was

This monthly photo column by Ken Murdock features railroad scenes of the past, a look back into railroading's history.



FEC's modern steam switchers were all Alco built, oil burning, 0-6-0s and 0-8-0s. This photo of 0-8-0 #257 in Miami in 1941 is one of 29 locomotives of this class built between 1924 and 1926. Twelve stayed on the roster until 1954 and 55. Number 253, presently being restored in Ft. Pierce, was sold to the Louisiana & Arkansas RR in 1936, which led to it being saved as a park display in 1956 in Texarkana, TX. *CFRHS*



The FEC had 15 of these 2-8-2 oil burning, steam locomotives built by Alco in 1925. Number 711 is an example of these powerful freight haulers that shared that duty with the 23, 800 class, 4-8-2s, that could also handle heavy passenger trains, and 15, 300 class, low-driver, 4-8-2s. All of these Mikados remained on the roster until 1955 with one leaving in late 1954. *CFRHS photo*



The FEC had 52 of these handsome 400 class, oil burning, 4-8-2s, built by Alco during 1924 to 1926, to handle their varnish. Number 446 is seen in this photo, at the Miami depot in 1935, as it was being prepared to depart northbound. Western Pacific, Cotton Belt and Western Railway of Alabama bought a number of these 4-8-2s during the depression and a few lasted on FEC's roster until 1955. *Florida Archives photo*

September 2015 Museum Report

We had our monthly museum workday on September 12, with six members participating who included Lloyd Brown, Allen Quinn, Jerry and Ginger Honeter, Clem Kruse and me. We accomplished a number of tasks which included our necessary housekeeping chores such as vacuuming, cleaning glass, cleaning the restroom and touching up the brown trim around the steps to the meeting room. Clem worked on filing items in the large format flat files and in the timetable binders. Jerry continued on inventory in the library, Allen worked on the caboose stove and I filed photos and bound more copies of our *Outline History of Central Florida Railroads* booklets while Lloyd took care of the wasps who continually move into our caboose without paying any rent.

We continued our Wednesday workdays throughout the month. Jerry worked on library inventory and Ginger took care of cleaning display cases in the mornings and hosting in the afternoons. Jerry now has all the books from the Richard Taylor donation (31 boxes) in the inventory system and on the shelves in the library. How did he fit all of them in? He relocated all duplicate books to storage in the Roper Building. We plan to offer them for sale to our members and to the visiting public. We have a fabulous library collection and our members need to use it more. Very few of you are checking out our books and I can almost guarantee you that we have books on your favorite railroad.

I continued working on the inventory of our collection on Wednesdays. With the Lakeville inventory completed, I have been primarily involved with adding recently donated items. I also relocated a number of items in our showcases to get related or similar items grouped together. This will better tell the story of what items were and how they were used, once improved signage is in place.

Ginger found a great photo in *Classic Trains* showing train orders being hooped up to the fireman on a steam locomotive. She suggested that it would help when trying to explain to visitors how the hoops were used. So, I enlarged it and laminated it and placed it on the wall in the corner of our meeting room where our order hoops are displayed. It will be a great teaching aid.

David Rhea is taking a large box of donated Lionel trains to a friend who will check them out, and get them running if necessary, so that we can sell them in our gift shop. Thanks David, for taking care of this!

Thanks to each of you who came out during the month and helped to improve our museum and our archives. Please be sure to record your volunteer hours in our log book.
