This Is The Way It Was

This monthly photo column by Ken Murdock features railroad scenes of the past, a look back into railroading's history.



Do you remember the Florida Fun Train of 1997? This train left from Poinciana, just below Kissimmee, for an entertaining ride to Miami. Their motto was "Soon you can trade 200 miles on the Florida Turnpike for 200 smiles on the Florida Fun Train". The fare was \$69.95 for adults and \$49.95 for kids over 2 years old. It made one round trip on Monday and Saturday and one and a half round trips on Friday and Sunday. This photo finds the train with F40PH 358 in Auburndale passing an Amtrak train. – *Bill Schnaiter photo*



The Train was a full dome car consist of one and two level cars. It was loaded with entertainment such as a video and virtual reality game arcade plus a professional cast of strolling musicians, singers, comedians, magicians, and clowns. There was a beer and wine pub and dining was on white linens in four person booths in the dome. This scene is also in Auburndale with F40PH 374 on the headend. - *Bill Schnaiter photo*



The train also had tropical island themed restaurants and lounges and a kid's play area. The kids could chow down on pizza and ice cream in a 50s-style diner with a soda fountain and stools. The motive power was leased Amtrak F40PH locomotives. This is F40PH 354 passing thru Winter Park, apparently returning from Sanford where it was probably serviced. We have continued the month with Wednesday workdays except for Thanksgiving week. We have done less construction work this month because interior framing is completed for phase one. We had to wait on the electrical and air conditioning contractors to finish their work. The air conditioning contractor did finish his rough-in and the electrical should finish his rough-in by the end of November. Then we can schedule a rough-in inspection. Once we pass the inspection, we can proceed with the sheetrock work.

Meanwhile, Jerry Honeter, Al Sharp, Irv Lipscomb and I turned back to doing some more inventory work. Ginger Honeter continued her never ending task of polishing silver and cleaning showcases, then hosting in the afternoons. Irv continued inventorying items in our flat files such as maps, calendars, artwork and posters.

We held our monthly museum workday on November 12, 2016, and had 5 members participating. Those who came out and pitched in were Joe Lehmann, Jarrod Reynolds, Jerry and Ginger Honeter and your curator. Joe took care of several computer issues and the rest of us took care of a variety of tasks including the very necessary housekeeping chores. Then we worked on inventory. Jerry finished his library inventory on all books recently donated and Al and Jarrod and I also finished our inventory of all recently donated museum items.

Ross Marvin has continued selling donated items on eBay and all of this money goes into the building fund. The last total that Ross reported since he started our eBay Store was more than \$4000 and climbing! All items sold were donated! This is pure profit and it all goes into our building fund! Thank you, Ross, for taking on this fund-raising effort and doing it so well!

We had a few donations during the month. Al Sharp donated a red, tall globe for a Dietz lantern with New York Central cast in the glass. Now we need to find a lantern for it. The second donation was a railroad depot freight cart made by Fairbanks. It was donated by Greg & Lisa Bennett of Winter Garden. It needs some restoration work and David Rhea and William Walter have volunteered to do this work at David's home. Thank you, David and William!

David and William also removed the rotting steps from the east side of the Roper Building. This will help us when we bring sheetrock into the building. We can back Jerry's truck up to the double doors and unload directly inside. Once we no longer need the doors for unloading, David and William will rebuild the steps since the doors will be required as an emergency exit.

Orlando Amtrak Station At Thanksgiving

I thought I'd share some photos I took today with the Society.

Today at the former Atlantic Coast Line station in Orlando, Amtrak's southbound and northbound Silver Meteors, trains 97 and 98, met on the platform. Hundreds of passengers, traveling for the Thanksgiving holiday weekend, crowded the station and platforms. If you include the brief SunRail stop and Conrad Yelvington working their rock train on the far tracks with their veteran EMD SW9, there were no less than four trains in the platform today! This was the busiest I have ever personally seen the Orlando station, and it filled me with joy to see so many people still taking the train. I also ran into Dave Rhea and his grandkids when they got off the SunRail. (They are visible in the foreground in one photo, walking away from the camera.)



On Saturday, November 19th, Central Florida Railway Historical Society Members Add Austin, Roger Wilson, Jerry & Ginger Honeter, Patrick Smith, and Phil Piet travelled to the Florida Railroad Museum (FRRM) in Parrish, Florida, for a delightful field trip.

The members rendezvoused at the FRRM in time for the 10:30 excursion on a beautiful fall day. It was perfect weather for a ride in the open-air gondola at the front end of the train. The motive power was FRRM #8330 (EMD GP-11). The unit was originally built in the 1950s for Union Pacific as a cabless 'booster' or B-unit, and was later given a cab and made able to operate on its own. It worked for the Illinois Central for quite some time, which is where it first received its current road number. Most recently, it worked on the former Inland Lakes Railway in Mt. Dora before being sold to the FRRM .

The group's day of railfanning ended with a late lunch at a delightful Italian restaurant in Bradenton. More pictures of the day's activities can be found at the beginning of the Rail News section of *The Flatwheel*.
